Summer Blast is a youth program presented by the Syracuse Library Foundation. It takes education beyond the classroom by providing students with unique, motivating, hands-on learning opportunities! Classes are designed to be fun, engaging and geared to incorporate science, technology, engineering, art and math. Summer Blast also emphasizes other important parts of the learning process such as: creative thinking, collaboration, experimentation and exploration.

Classes are offered for students completing grades K-6th in the Spring of 2024. Class selection for enrollment should be based on your student's current grade for the Spring 2024 semester. This program is facilitated by the Syracuse Library Foundation, with classes being held at the Syracuse Middle School.
